Since we are at impasse, PJTA and the district are in the process of choosing a mediator. Once a mediator is chosen, negotiations will continue.

VOTE-COPE

Many of our members do not realize how VOTE-COPE is important to our union. VOTE-COPE stands for Voice of Teachers for Education – Committee on Political Education.

VOTE-COPE support comes in the form of phone banks, mailers, commercials, print ads, and direct contributions to campaign committees. VOTE-COPE does not take positions regarding wars, gun control, abortion, death penalty, etc... NYSUT respects everyone's views on all of these issues.

The money supports both the Democrats and Republicans. Often NYSUT will give a contribution to incumbents as they hold the most powerful positions. Every year at times NYSUT has to put up a battle in a hostile environment. Powerful Congressional leaders want to reduce our salaries and benefits, remove tenure rights, reduce/change our defined benefit pensions, utilize vouchers, and eliminate Triborough protections.

A huge portion of our VOTE-COPE contribution is returned directly to our local. Twenty percent is rebated automatically, and another twenty percent may be requested for local educational issue campaigns.

Some VOTE-COPE accomplishments:

- Legislative accomplishments like Triborough (This makes sure that when our contract sunsets, the language in the contract is kept until a new contract is in place)
- A permanent Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for our pensions
- Safe-guarding tenure rights
- Annual education budgetary increases from Albany virtually every year.

Without NYSUT's ability to effectively lobby in Albany, our union would be ineffective. Our dues, by law, are not allowed to be used for lobbying, VOTE-COPE depends on the contributions of every member to stay strong. Please give generously to this year's VOTE-COPE campaign!


